You have the right to pump breastmilk at work in New Jersey.

Your employer must allow reasonable break time to pump your milk if you ask for it.



Most employees need 15-20 minutes to express breast milk, plus time to wash hands, set up and store their pump, and store the milk. The break time can be unpaid time. Your employer must also provide a private place, close to your work area, for you to pump. IT MAY NOT BE A BATHROOM.



It must have a chair, a shelf or table for holding the pump and a door which can be locked from the inside. You may need to take a break to pump at least every 3 hours, especially if your baby is less than six months old.



The right to pump at your job lasts as long as you are breastfeeding your child, even beyond 1 year.

If your rights have been violated, you can file a complaint with the New Jersey Division on Civil Rights (NJDCR) at NJCivilRights.gov or call 973-648-2700.
